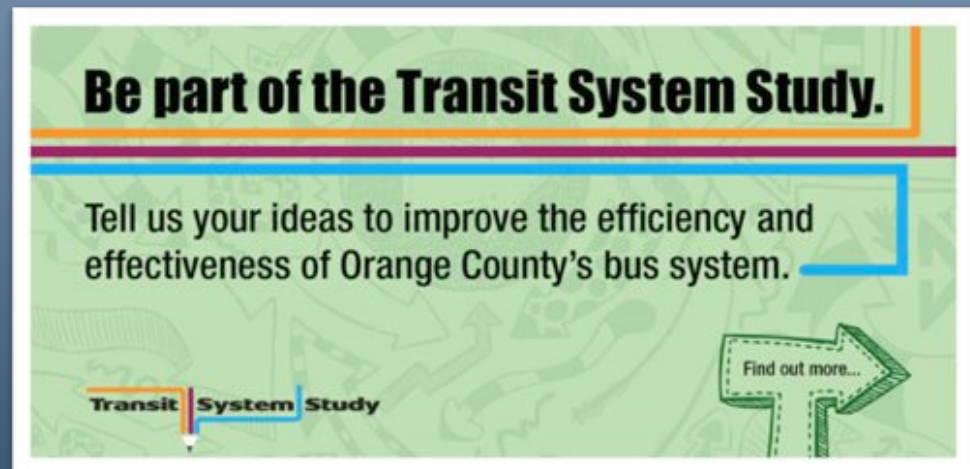
# Public Outreach

  - Potential ACCESS impacts



# Favorably Received

- Improved travel time and frequency
- “Rapids”
- More ridership for more revenue
- Partnerships to leverage funding
- Express bus on freeway
- Service to major, popular destinations
- Service where people need it most
- Different types of services, vehicles
- Improved bus-to-train connections



# Concerns

- “Rapids” in lieu of local service
- Wholesale bus stop removal
- Truncated routes
- Service reductions and/or route eliminations
- Potential ACCESS impacts
- Impacts on students and people with special needs
- New, unclear service concepts
